This is information that I obtained as an attendee at the 1st meeting.

Bureau County has received a grant from FEMA thru IEMA to develop a Mitigation Plan and they have invited Marshall and Stark County and all municipalities within those counties to participate.

#### What is Mitigation?

Mitigation is an action taken by an individual or a community in a pre-disaster setting to reduce the potential for damage in the future, or action taken by an individual or community or post-disaster to break the disaster/repair/disaster cycle.

#### Benefits of being a part of the Plan:

- 1) Save valuable tax dollars at the Federal, state and local level;
- 2) Preserve the life, health and safety of the residents of the community; and
- 3) Protect the economic health of the community
- 4) Speed up the recovery process after a disaster
- 5) There is no direct cost to the participating municipalities
- 6) Ensures eligibility for programs that require formal adoption prior to funding

It is expected that the planning process will take about a year with 6-9 meetings.

Planning team may consists of members for the City Council, Village Board or County Board, community planner, Building official, community engineer, community health official, public works personnel, emergency manager, business community, Hazard area residents and conservation groups or park groups. The same people do not have to attend all the meetings, just to each municipality has representation at each meeting.

#### The Plan Will:

Identify and Map Hazards, Profile Hazards, Risk Assessment, Setting Goals, Identify what has already been done, Brainstorming Alternatives, Evaluate Actions, Flood Mitigation Alternatives, Wind Mitigation Alternatives, Snow Load Mitigation Alternatives, Adopting the Plan, Evaluating the Plan
