SERVICE OF ALCOHOL BY PEOPLE UNDER THE AGE OF 21

Whereas, the Village of Bradford has determined that age restriction on service of alcoholic beverages should be regulated for the public safety.

Therefore, be it ordained, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Bradford, Stark County, Illinois, As Follows:

SECTION ONE. No person under the age of 21 shall sell alcohol to any other person, unless they meet the following requirements:

- 1. The person must be over the age of 18 years.
- 2. The person who wishes to serve alcohol must fill out a petition to sell alcohol at Village Hall.
 - a. That Petition must contain the following information:
 - i. Petitioner's Full Legal Name
 - ii. Petitioner's Address
 - iii. Petitioner's Birth Date
 - iv. A copy of the Petitioner's Driver's License or State ID Card
 - v. Petitioner's Telephone Number
 - vi. The Sponsoring Business' Name, Address, and Telephone Number.
 - vii. The Name, Address, and Telephone Number of not less than Five non-related References.
 - viii. A check from the Sponsoring Business for \$250.00.
- 3. The Petition shall be reviewed by the Liquor Commissioner and the Liquor Commissioner has the full ability to reject or approve the Petitioner's Petition.
 - a. If the Petition is approved,
 - i. The Petitioner shall have the ability to serve alcohol at any business that sells alcoholic beverages that are to be consumed on the premises of the Sponsoring Business, as long as there is another person, who is currently on duty at the Sponsoring Business is over the age of 21.
 - 1. At all times when the Petitioner is on duty, the Sponsoring Business must have a log that details the Petitioner's time, and the name of the person over the age of 21 that is on duty during the time the Petitioner is working.

- 2. At no time is the person, who is over the age of 21 on the log at the same as the Petitioner is working, allowed to be intoxicated while the Petitioner is working.
- ii. The Petitioner shall not be allowed to sell any packaged alcoholic beverages or any alcoholic beverages that are meant to be consumed off the premises of the Sponsoring Business.
- iii. The Check from the Sponsoring Business shall be deposited by the Village of Bradford and shall be held by the Village for the duration of the employment of the Petitioner, as per the regulations in Paragraph 4.
- b. If the Petition is rejected:
 - i. The Village of Bradford will return the Sponsoring Business's \$250.00 check.
 - ii. The Petitioner may appeal to the Village Board within 30 days of the rejection letter's mailing by submitting an appeal to the Village of Bradford Clerk.
- 4. If the Petition is successful, the Village of Bradford shall deposit and hold the \$250.00 from the Sponsoring Business, under the following terms:
 - a. The \$250.00 is a security retainer.
 - b. If the Petitioner is convicted of any criminal offense related to their employment with the Sponsoring Business, then the \$250.00 from the Sponsoring Business may be forfeited to the Village of Bradford.
 - c. The \$250.00 shall be returned to the Sponsoring Business if:
 - i. More than 6 months has elapsed after:
 - 1. The Petitioner has be terminated, resigned, or quit the Sponsoring Business, or
 - 2. The Petitioner has attained the age of 21 years.

SECTION TWO. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION THREE. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or words thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or words have been declared invalid or unconstitutional, and if for any reason this ordinance should be declared invalid or unconstitutional, then the remaining ordinance provisions will be in full force and effect.

SECTION FOUR

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on May 1st, 2018.
